golden boy



As a senior at Pratt Institute a few years ago, Jashar Awan created illustrations for a version of Michael Chabon's 2000 novel The Amazing Adventures of Kavalier and Clay. The summer after graduating, Awan met Diana Schutz, editor of Dark Horse Comics, which had just begun publishing The Amazing Adventures of the Escapist—the Escapist being the superhero created by Chabon's protagonists. Awan showed his illustrated Kavalier and Clay to Schutz, who passed it on to Chabon. "He's written some of the most flattering e-mails that I've ever received," says Awan, whose work often appears in The New Yorker. "He even asked for a second copy to give to Stephen Daldry, who's directing the movie." Schutz later commissioned Awan to create faux-classic covers for "Collecting the Golden Age Escapist," an article by Steve Duin that imagines the search for the fictional Kavalier and Clay's comics. The collaboration is now a six-issue series, The Escapists, which broke in July. Although its cover price says 10 cents, each copy sells for a dollar. "The 10-cents claim," Awan says, "was just to make my illustrations look more authentic," STEVEN HELLER
